The Kids for Kids program was a success! The program was made possible through the Claude Worthington Benedum Foundation and the National Road Heritage Corridor, under the leadership of Dr. Jason Margolis. Kids for Kids was designed to uplift youth facing hardship through art, while fostering empathy and the development of literacy skills in K-12 students. Among the 5 schools participating in the spring program, 25 students from IU1 Redstone, McMurray, and Waynesburg campuses completed various art projects between November 2022 and May 2023. The program included five rounds of projects, which allowed students to learn more about who they were creating art for and just how impactful their work could be in another student's life. The first round of projects involved getting art back from other schools, while the other four rounds involved creating art for students facing hardship in shelters or in the community with special needs. The IU1 Campus schools, students and teachers alike, all enjoyed the project and hope to continue the program in the future.
