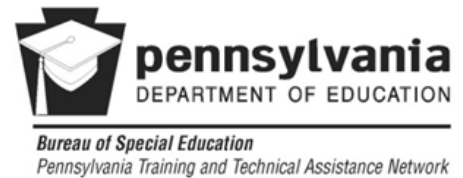

**January 3, 2018  
(9:00 am – 3:30 pm)**  
**IDEA Training for Charter Schools**  
**PaTTAN - Pittsburgh**

Designed to support charter school educators and leaders in their understanding and application of IDEA and Chapter 711, this session will address key touch points throughout the process of identifying and providing services for students with disabilities. This session will be interactive to provide clarification and opportunity to interact with regulatory information and school-related scenarios.

**January 10, 2018 (9:00 am – 3:30 pm)**  
**Tools for Your Speech Language Toolbox: Place Voice Manner Charting and Intelligibility Measures**  
**PaTTAN - Pittsburgh**

Diagnostics are the key to appropriate identification and dismissal of students from speech language services. There are many tools that are used in an effective assessment. Two tools that are useful for SLP to determine a student's current level of functioning and to plan intervention or dismissal are place voice manner charting (PVM) and intelligibility measures. Use of PVM charting is a quick way to determine the skills in a student's sound system and to reflect upon these skills in order to select evidence based treatment methods. In addition to PVM analysis, taking intelligibility measures is a quick and effective way to assess the student's communication skills. This session will be hands on practice to effectively take data utilizing these two methods and how to document the data appropriately.

**Universal Screening for Behavior: Nuts and Bolts to Implementation**  
**PaTTAN - Pittsburgh**

Universal screening of behavior is a research validated means to detect individual students or groups of students at risk of achieving poor learning outcomes and/or developing behavior problems. This session will focus on the rationale and benefits for the use of universal screening of behavior. Participants will discuss the characteristics of evidence based screeners and commercially available screening tools. A demonstration on how to organize intervention grids to provide supports to groups of students as well as individual students will also be provided.

**Building Administrator Capacity: A Focus on Secondary Transition**  
**PaTTAN - Pittsburgh**

Through this training series, administrators who serve as Local Education Agency (LEA) representatives will become equipped with tools to lead compliant and best practice secondary transition programs to meet the needs of students of transition-age. In addition, administrators will review their current practices related to secondary transition and determine ways in which to enhance programming for successful post-secondary goals for all students.

**Making AEC Meaningful for Students with the Most Significant Cognitive Disabilities**

This course will provide participants an opportunity to explore alternate eligible content and intents across subject areas and learn ways to make it meaningful for these students at the least complex content level. Essentialized examples, sample content targets, and instructional activities will be shared.

Matters such as customized employment, entitlement vs eligibility, and exploring the option of a two or four year college, are just a few of the topics that may be explored during the transition process. During this webinar, PaTTAN consultants will introduce available resources such as the Family 1-Page Guides and Planning for the Future Checklist to LEAs and discuss strategies for sharing them with parents and family members in supporting youth in preparing for post-secondary education, employment, and independent living.

**Webinar**

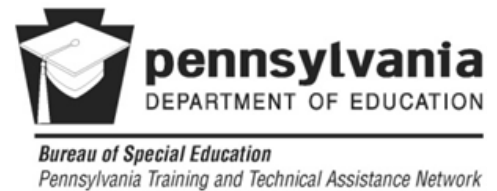

**February 7, 2018 (8:30 am – 4:45 pm)**

*Pennsylvania LETRS: Language Essentials for Teachers of Reading and Spelling*

**PA LETRS Module 4, 2nd Ed.: The Mighty Word: Building Vocabulary and Oral Language**  
**PaTTAN - Pittsburgh**

In Module 4 the focus is on building vocabulary and oral language. The learner will increase knowledge of

relationships among words and the effective instructional practices to increase students' vocabulary.

**February 8, 2018 (4:00 pm – 6:00 pm)**

**The Writing Toolkit for Students who are Deaf/Hard of Hearing: Genre, Discipline Specific Writing**

**Webinar**

In this session, participants continue to develop the knowledge and skills necessary to improve writing instruction for students who are deaf or hard of hearing. Phases of genre-specific writing instruction, such as learning about genre, evaluating genre, and writing genre, will be discussed. Because students who are knowledgeable about text structure, recall and write text better than others who aren't, this session will highlight the importance of making text structure for the genres of narrative, informational/explanatory, and opinion/argumentative writing visually explicit.

**Using Rate of Improvement (ROI) to Inform Instructional Intensity and Response to Intervention**

**PaTTAN - Pittsburgh**

In this introductory session, participants will understand how to use progress-monitoring data to inform instructional intensity across the tiers. Case studies will be used to situate the importance of ROI calculation as an RtI methodology within the context of a Multi-Tiered System of Supports (MTSS).

**Roman Numeral II: Unpacking Sign to Voice Essentials**

**Videoconference – PaTTAN Pittsburgh and sites across Pennsylvania**

The intent of this training is to review the elements important to Roman Numeral II: Sign to Voice. Participants will focus on matching the signer's register and affect. We will view a variety of child signers and focus on word choices that reflect the register of the child. Individuals will learn how to avoid extraneous verbiage that distracts from the message and how to develop a more fluent representation of the signer's ASL/PSE into spoken English.

**Supplementary Aids and Services Consideration Toolkit: An Introduction**

**Webinar**

The Supplementary Aids and Services (SaS) Consideration Toolkit provides IEP teams a process to determine the supports and services a student needs in order to be successful. Using the SaS Toolkit, teams analyze the instructional, physical, and social environment of a general education classroom from the perspective of an individual student. The intended outcome of using the SaS Toolkit is to identify a list of environmentally-referenced supplementary aids and services to enhance participation and learning for a student with a disability in the general education classroom.

**DIBELS Math Essentials Training Workshop**

**PaTTAN - Pittsburgh**

Participants will be provided with the DIBELS Math Essential Training Workshop. Participants will learn the foundations of DIBELS Math and the administration and scoring of the DIBELS Math subtests. Subtests will be modeled and participants will have practice opportunities with DIBELS Math subtest administration and scoring.

**PaPOS Exit Survey Overview and Procedural Training**

**Webinar**

This session will provide participants with an understanding of the Pennsylvania Post School Outcome Survey (PaPOS) and the requirements for implementation. The purpose of PaPOS is to determine, for the state as a whole, the extent to which students are achieving transition outcomes as stated in their Individualized Education Programs (IEPs). This is a required training for LEAs.

### March 14, 2018 (9:00 am – 3:30 pm) International Phonetic Alphabet (IPA) Review

#### PaTTAN - Pittsburgh

The International Phonetic Alphabet (IPA) is a notation system for the sounds of oral language. The correct use of the IPA system is required in assessing students with

speech sound disorders with formalized assessment tools. The system also involves the transfer of sound descriptions between providers and use in the analysis of the student's sound system. We will also discuss the phonemes in the American English Standard and Spanish dialects. This course is intended to be a refresher only.

### March 15, 2018 (8:30 am – 4:00 pm)

#### DIBELS Math Data Interpretation

##### PaTTAN Pittsburgh

This training offers advanced training in the application of DIBELS Math data within a Multi-Tiered System of Support (MTSS). Practitioners will interpret DIBELS Math data at the systems, classroom, and student levels (K-6). Participants will also engage in instructional grouping and matching, goal setting, and the evaluation of current evidence-based methodologies for improving outcomes for all students. Interdisciplinary teams and/or practitioners are strongly encouraged to bring their own grade and/or student level data for analysis. It is strongly recommended that participants attend the DIBELS Math Essentials Training prior to attending this workshop.

##### PA LETRS Module 5, 2nd Ed.: Getting Up to Speed:

##### Developing Fluency

##### PaTTAN - Pittsburgh

Module 5 reviews the rationale for a fluency component in lesson design. Participants learn and practice techniques for speed drills, repeated readings, simultaneous and alternate oral reading, calculating reading fluency, and charting the results of exercises. (Focus: Kindergarten through Second Grade; Remedial Instruction)

Participants will briefly review the conceptual underpinnings of ROI and learn how to make contextually-informed decisions use ROI trajectories. Exemplars for writing evaluation reports using RtI Methodologies will also be shared.
